Bryan Harvey will serve as Parliamentarian for the meeting.

Jim thanked former Board members Rick Bunt and Mary Dykes. Rick was instrumental in negotiating the new MOU and advising on ICT matter, and Mary for assisting with the newsletter and keeping our website up to date.

2. Approval of the Agenda

Moved by Murray Scharf and seconded by Ken Smith that the agenda be approved. Unanimous.

3. Approval of Minutes of September 12, 2023

Moved by David Mandeville and seconded by Bob Card that the minutes of September 12, 2023 be approved. Unanimous.

4. Co-President's Report

Jim Thornhill and Merry Beazely presented the attached Co-President's Report and highlighted the following –

- reviewed the award recipients honored at the Awards and Wrap-Up Celebration held on May 30;
 a list of recipients is included in the Awards Committee Report
- the second MOU between the university and USRA was signed on March 27, 2024; thanked Rick Bunt, Dara Hrytzak and Marcy Hildebrand for their guidance
- the President's Reception for New Retirees was held on June 19; Board members were in attendance and had an opportunity to speak with new retirees about our activities and benefits, answered questions on what we do; thanked President Stoicheff for reinstating the event which acknowledges the service of USask employees
- David Mandeville has agreed to serve as USRA representative on the University Senate

- welcomed new members Joe Angel and Peggy Proctor to the Board.

5. Treasurer's Report

Tom Wilson presented his 2023-2024 report noting the following -

- financial position continues to be stable; assets continue to grow during the fiscal year with no cash liabilities; total assets of \$54,661.59
- TCU Financial found a term deposit valued at \$5,608.45 which had not shown up previously; enjoyed increased interest in our deposits; currently have 11 one-year term deposits at 4.15% to 4.3%
- reviewed revenue and expenses for fiscal years 2022-2023, 2023-2024 and projections for 2024-2025.

There were questions about whether a financial review or audit of USRA finances should be conducted. Tom explained that this has not been considered necessary for our association but he will look into it.

Moved by Tom Wilson and seconded by Joe Angel that the Treasurer's Report be accepted. Unanimous.

Moved by Tom Wilson and seconded by Lin Whitworth that no financial audit for the 2024-2025 fiscal year be conducted. Unanimous.

- the committee worked with University Communications to promote the newest USRA award Let's Fly Up Together (ohpahotân | oohpaahotaan).

- USRA Board member, Vera Pezer, sits on the USask Stone Barn Fundraising Committee
- a Proposal for Asset Management of USask Heritage Artifacts has been submitted to the Provost and Vice-President Academic Dr. Airini for consideration. The proposal recommends the university undertake a process to manage the valuable artifacts and memorabilia that exist across campus
- name of the committee has been changed to Campus Heritage
- thanked the committee for all their hard work.

(i) Ad Hoc Committee on USRA Documents

University of Saskatchewan Retirees Association Treasurer's Report for 2023-2024

ASSETS:

Our assets continued to grow during the fiscal year July 1, 2023 to June 30, 2024. TCU Financial found a term deposit of \$5,608.46 which had not shown up previously! We also enjoyed increased interest in our Term Deposits (TDs). We have eleven 1-year TDs at 4.15 to 4.3% that mature in August, September, October, November, January, March, May and June. I indicate their total value at maturity.

The table on the next page is a summary of our revenue and expenses.

REVENUE:

We received our grant from USask. Lifetime memberships were greater than expected as was the final payment to us from CURAC 2023. Note the \$2,000 of "miscellaneous revenue". In June we redeemed our "found TD." We added \$2,000 to our current account and bought another TD for \$3,608.46. The "CURAC rebate" includes \$680 for the August "surprise invoice" (see below), the CURAC travel rebate, and the final accounting for CURAC 2023.

EXPENSES:

The New Retirees Event on June 19th was entirely subsidized by USask.

Our Awards Banquet, held in May, cost \$2,261.88 (meals plus award costs) while ticket sales were \$1,685. Our loss was \$568.88.

Total cost for our monthly lunch meetings was \$9,925.35 while ticket sales were \$8,458. This deficit was \$1,467.35.

Office supplies came in at \$689.43; more than expected. We pay an annual license fee for our software.

Travel costs for our CURAC 2024 (Waterloo ON) representative were under budget: \$2,218 vs. \$2,500. In August 2023 we received an invoice from USask for \$1,360. This was for CURAC 2023 expenses which had been mistakenly charged to another account that ours. We split this debt 50/50 with CURAC. Their half appears in Revenue as "CURAC rebate."

I present our budget estimate for 2024-2025.

Very few things in life are certain. One thing that is, however, is that social interaction and engagement is of crucial importance to everyone, and especially to older folk who have left the world of work and who may have challenges with mobility and access to the larger world. Often, too, in our highly mobile society we are separated from our families, sometimes by great distances. Thus, the social connections provided by the USRA's Education, Social, and Recreation Committee are intended to keep community alive among those who served the University of Saskatchewan and to provide social connectedness for all retirees who can and wish to partake.

From the fall of 2023 to the late spring of 2024 the USRA hosted a variety of very well-received presentations from an eclectic group of engaging speakers. In September 2023 we had the second in our series of presentations from Jeff O'Brien, City Archivist who will continue the story of our city again this year. The Campus Heritage Committee met a number of times this past year, and I extend my thanks to members for all for their hard work. Please find below highlights:

Spotlight on USask History

We look forward to making this a regular feature in our USRA newsletters. In November, Kathryn wrote about the Herzberg Experimental Hall being officially named at the Canadian Light Source, in honour of Gerhard Herzberg who received the Nobel Prize in Chemistry in 1971. This affirmed that Canada and USask are world leaders in spectroscopy—the science of using light to understand the structure of molecules. In April's edition, Vera contributed "Creating a Future for USask's Iconic Stone Barn." Vera is also USRA's representative on the Stone Barn Fundraising Group. Meetings with University Colleagues

- President Stoicheff invited the committee to meet with him about the USRA's interest in preserving
 heritage on campus, including built heritage. The discussion focused on the Stone Barn, which has been
 identified as the highest priority to preserve.
- Meeting with Library leaders Charlene Sorensen and Tim Hutchinson to explore the issue of support for all local artifact collections on campus (outside of already established museums) as well as possible suitability of the University Library as a home for this support.
- Meetings with several colleges and departments to review what inventories are already in place. The committee also toured the extensive collections held at Chemistry and Physics.

Proposal for Asset Management of USask Heritage Artifacts

Based on the discussions above, the committee developed a proposal for the university to undertake a process to manage the valuable artifacts and memorabilia that exist across campus. The proposal was discussed by the Board, with Co-President Jim noting that the role of the USRA will be to advise and support such an initiative. The proposal was submitted to Provost and VP Academic Dr. Airini, and in June, Yannis and Co-President Merry met with the Provost and Charlene Sorensen, Interim Dean of the Library to discuss. Their response to the first step in the proposal – to undertake an inventory of valued assets – was positive. This will involve pursuing and obtaining strategic funding; determining where a 'central managing position' could be located; developing terms of reference; and employing an individual with appropriate expertise. We are looking forward to hearing more from the Provost later this fall.

Yannis Pahatouroglou, Judith Henderson and Caroline Cottrell are stepping away from the Board and we thank them for all their time and effort in growing the USRA mandate.

We are very pleased that Peggy Proctor has agreed to let her name stand to join the USRA Board. Peggy was a Clinical Associate Professor in the Master of Physical Therapy Program in the School of Rehabilitation Science at the University of Saskatchewan. Joining the University in 1998, she held the position of Academic Lead for Clinical Education and Community Affairs for the School. Prior to coming to Saskatoon, she worked as a physiotherapist in many clinical areas and geographic locations within Canada and abroad. In 2021 she received the Canadian Physiotherapy Association Centenary Medal of Distinction for making impactful contributions to the profession of physiotherapy during her career. Peggy was actively involved in responding to Calls to Action for the Truth and Reconciliation Commission and has had a special and continued interest in the professional and ethical issues surrounding the practice of physical therapy. Upon her retirement this year, Peggy was honored by the indigenous community for her many years of work towards Aboriginal recruitment and engagement within the School of Rehabilitative Science and her sustained involvement in Indigenous Truth and Reconciliation.

We are also pleased that Dr. Joe Angel, former Head of the Department of Biochemistry (now the Department of Biochemistry, Microbiology and Immunology) has agreed to join the USRA Board. Dr. Angel received his Ph.D. in Nutrition in 1971 from the University of Toronto and then worked as an Assistant Professor of Human Nutrition at UBC from 1969 until 1975 before coming to the U of S. He developed one of the earliest nutrition courses for medical students, when nutrition was first shown as an essential determinant of healthy living. Dr. Angel's research interests included the metabolic responses to Vitamin B-6 deficiency, development of lipid metabolism during weaning and mathematical models of metabolism. Joe served as Department Head of Biochemistry for 11 years (1987-1998) and was very active as an administrator at the departmental, college and university level, where he served on numerous committees, including Chair of University Council for 2 years. Dr. Angel was also an associate member of the Department of Computer Science and assisted in developing and teaching undergraduate and graduate courses in Bioinformatics. Since his retirement from the University in 2009, Joe has served on the Board of Directors for Fairview Court (housing unit for low-income retirees) and Board of Directors for the Scottish Rite Charitable Foundation. Dr. Angel has a vast interest in and knowledge of the university, its history and management. This experience will be helpful to retirees as we continue to build our strong relationship with the university.
