## IN MEMORIUM

**Jim Wedgwood** passed away on January 7, 2003. He held various positions over the years including Superintendent of Building and Grounds, Director of Planning, and Executive Director of the Universities Commission.

**Frank Szombathy** died on April 9, 2003. Initially appointed as Purchasing Agent, he subsequently became Director of Administrative services.

**Robert (Bob) Hayton,** Professor of Medicine (Cardiology) died on April 9, 2003. He was a member of the Faculty of Medicine for almost twenty years. An athlete as well as an academic, he was a member of the Edmonton Eskimos when they won the Grey Cup in 1954.
