




#### RETIREES HONOURED

**Thelma Howard** was awarded the Queen's Jubilee Medal at a ceremony held recently in Saskatoon in recognition of her work with the Canadian University Services Overseas (CUSO).

The Queen's Jubilee Medal is awarded to Canadians who over the past 50 years, have helped shape Canada through outstanding and exemplary achievment or service to Canada or their community.

Roger Carter was the first winner of the Willy Hodgson Award created by the Law Society of Saskatchewan. He was honoured for helping pave the way for aboriginal law students. As Dean of Law Carter was responsible for establishing the Native Law Centre. It was the first program of its kind in Canada. Willy Hodgson was a Cree elder who was a member of the Saskatchewan Legal Aid Commission and of the Moose Jaw Police Commission, and who was appointed to the Law Society of Saskatchewan as a lay bencher.

#### IN MEMORIAM

**Dan McFadden,** died on November 15, 2003. He was Clinical Professor of Surgery at the University of Saskatchewan and Chief of Surgery at St. Paul's Hospital.

**Stephen Pastershank,** passed away on November 25, 2003. A graduate of the U of S College of Medicine, he returned after postgraduate training at McGill to take up a faculty appointment in the Department of Radiology.

**Jim Pepper,** Professor Emeritus of Chemistry, died on November 27, 2003. He was a member of the Department for thirty eight years and served as Department Head for several years.
