Message from President Jim Blackburn

The USRA had a most successful two-year term under Murray Scharf's guidance in meeting the objectives of our organization, "to enhance the quality of life of our members by providing services and activities addressing their needs and desires" and "to provide support and services to the University of Saskatchewan." A special motion expressing our thanks to Murray for his outstanding leadership was passed unanimously at our 2009 AGM.

Our annual general meeting was held on Monday, September 21. The 35 members in attendance received annual reports from President Murray Scharf (*in absentia*, as he was leading a Rotary delegation to Scotland) and from each of the committee chairs. Fifty-five members and their guests attended the Banquet, where the USRA recognized long-time Executive Member and Honorary Member Norah Carey for her significant contributions to our Association over many years. Norah's daughter and son were with her on this occasion. We were also pleased to have Chancellor Vera Pezer provide greetings

from the University and update members on current university activities and concerns.

During the past year, there was a wide variety of USRA educational offerings, and at the AGM members made several excellent suggestions for new topics and programming.

On October 15, Vice President Richard Florizone started our fall speaker series with a talk entitled *The Nuclear Industry and the University of Saskatchewan,* and on November 19, Vice President Brett Fairburn will speak on the topic *Planning: The Academic Future of the University of Saskatchewan.* On December 7, Dr. Michael Atkinson will speak on the topic: *The Nature of the School of Public Policy and Some Governance and Public Policy Issues of Current Concern.* A partial listing of programming for 2009-2010 is included in this newsletter.

Through the efforts of Kurt Tischler and Robert Sanche, the International Students' Emergency Loan Fund has been revised by the International Student Office. The intent is to provide monetary assistance for worthy international students enrolled at the University who are in dire need of financial assistance. USRA members will be encouraged to contribute to this fund as part of the University's charitable donations program.

Robert Sanche and Nancy Senior are in the process of revamping the *USRA Newsletter* to make it more appealing and interesting to our members. At the 142 Annual Meeting of the Canadian Medical Association held in Saskatoon in August 2009, retiree John Owen was inducted as an honorary life member. John served at the University of Saskatchewan for many years as professor in the Department of Community Health and Epidemiology. Dr. Owen was honoured particularly for his extensive contributions to the International Studies Program in the College of Medicine and his work in placing more than 200 medical students in developing countries for their elective course in Community Medicine.

Professor Emeritus David Kaplan was recently honoured when the Saskatoon Composers' Concert Society established the new David L. Kaplan Concert Series. David was a key builder of the University of Saskatchewan Music Department and of the Saskatoon Symphony.
