

## Message from the President Dale Miquelon

There is also the task ahead of us of building up a photo archive on our website. Going through old photos of the likes of Jack Pringle and Doug Knott reminds me that our association has been around for over twenty years and can be said to have a history itself. In the last few years, the number of Faculty and ASPA members retiring each year has been smaller than a decade ago. It is important to invite new Retirees to become USRA members and to reconnect with those who

The monthly luncheon Speaker Series at Manos Restaurant is also very popular as are the special seminars or workshops such as the very successful "Driving for Seniors" and "Computers for Seniors," and our Prime of Life Achievement Awards have all been exceedingly worthwhile. It is good to get together to enjoy ourselves, to stay connected to the University, and even to learn new things in the process.

Elsewhere in this issue you will read about other, new benefits being negotiated with the University of Saskatchewan. The more members we have, the more feasible these programs and benefits become. We need numbers not only for the vitality and renewal they bring to the USRA, but because strong, active membership helps us to maintain these programs.

# **USRA Membership And Dues**

Any faculty or ASPA retiree can become a member of the USRA by paying the appropriate membership dues to the USRA Treasurer at the address below.

Membership dues in the USRA have remained unchanged for more than a decade. At the September 2011 Annual General Meeting, a dues increase was approved so that on July 1 2012, annual membership dues will go from \$15 to \$20 and each category of Life Membership will increase by \$20, depending on the age of the Retiree, according to the following schedule:

# Prime of Life Achievement Awards

The University of Saskatchewan Retirees Association (USRA) requests your assistance in identifying prospective recipients for the Prime of Life Achievement Award (PLAA), which honours and shows appreciation of recognition given to persons who have retired from work at the University. If you know an individual who fits the Award description below, please submit a nomination.

## History

The University and its respective Colleges often recognize and reward employees for outstanding accomplishments. However, if after retirement a former University employee receives special awards or recognition, the University does not have a mechanism by which to offer congratulations. In 1997, the USRA inaugurated such a mechanism. The first Prime of Life Awards were given in 1997 to a backlog of 60 worthy recipients. Since that time, a further 31 Awards have been presented.

## **Award Description**

The PLAA honours and expresses appreciation of persons who have retired from work at the University and who, *after their retirement*, have been recognized for outstanding scholarly, artistic or service contributions. Such contributions would have been recognized by international, national, provincial or local bodies (e.g., Order of Canada, Saskatchewan Order of Merit, honorary lifetime recognitions from national or provincial professional societies or associations, honorary degrees, national artistic commissions, Saskatoon Citizen of the Year). The Awards are presented at the banquet following the USRA AGM in the Fall.

## **Nomination Forms**

The Prime of Life Achievement Awards Committee invites nominations from the University Community; however, anyone may nominate a worthy candidate. Should you require nomination forms, please send us an email at <u>ss.usra@usask.ca</u> or download a form from the USRA website www.usra.usask.ca. Please note that two signatures are required for the nomination and a **complete postretirement CV** may be requested.

Nominations may be submitted at any time, but must be received by April 30 to be considered for an Award in that same year.

# USRA Achieves Enhanced Benefits and Volunteer Roles

## Ad hoc Committee on the Future of the USRA

Members of an Ad hoc committee of the USRA executive spent the last two years considering the future course of the organization. They found that the USRA provides a range of social and intellectual activities that equals or exceeds that of other Canadian associations of academic retirees. Therefore, the committee concentrated on finding ways to provide enhanced benefits to members and to provide service to the university and community through volunteer activities.

The committee has obtained a number of new benefits for members of the USRA. These include discounts at the bookstore and computer store and associate membership in the Alumni Association (with the benefits of full membership, including a PAC discount). A membership card is being prepared which will provide access to these benefits. The card will also serve as proof of status as a retiree of the U. of S. The committee is involved in discussions with university officials that may well result in an enhanced membership card which will also provide discounts at commercial outlets on and off campus, including bus service, super markets and restaurants.

As a result of many meetings with representatives of a multitude of administrative entities, a formal, permanent and funded framework has been established to provide volunteer services to departments and colleges of the U of S and to the community at large.

Six working groups made up of USRA Executive members and university officials have been created to further develop volunteer activities. One of the groups has become a standing committee of the USRA Executive charged with nominating candidates for honorary degrees. A university committee consisting of three representatives from the USRA Executive will monitor the activities of the working groups. A formal evaluation of the retiree engagement strategy will be carried out in 2013.

The three USRA representatives on the monitoring committee will form the new Retirement Engagement Committee of the USRA Executive. This committee will continue negotiations with the university administration concerning additional benefits for members of the USRA, including free parking for volunteers, and ways in which retirees can be of service to the U Of S.
